Dear Mr. Roth:

I just wanted to send this letter to you to tell you about an experience I had with Militec-1. I am in sales and I depend on my car as I travel a lot. I put Militec-1 in my car a few months ago. During the week just prior to the fourth of July which was on a Saturday this year, I was working in Tennessee over 300 miles from home.

When I left Tennessee to go home, after just a few miles I blew the main bearing seal on my Lincoln Towncar. My oil pressure immediately dropped to zero as indicated by the onboard computer which showed no oil pressure. I immediately stopped the car and checked the dipstick. I couldn't detect any oil on it. When I looked under the car, the entire undercarriage was just covered with oil. This told me all of it was out of the engine. Because I was working out of state and because it was a holiday, service was not readily available. I figured that if the engine temperature did not go up, the engine was still protected by Militec-1 and I could continue to drive. This turned out to be the case as the temperature did not rise as I drove.

In Chattanooga, which is 200 miles from home, I added two quarts of oil. Within ten minutes, I had no pressure again, and the dipstick showed no oil in the crankcase. As before, I just continued to drive and the computer showed no rise in temperature. I didn't lose any coolant, which also indicated normal operating temperature. For the remaining 200 miles, I added no more oil and the engine functioned as if there was no problem except that the computer continued to flash and beep, telling me there was no oil pressure and that I should check the oil!

On Monday, I took my car to a very experienced mechanic for service. He pulled the engine and found there was no damage to the crankshaft or other engine parts. The only thing he replaced was the rear main bearing seal.

I realize this is not a very scientific report and it will be hard for many people to believe, but it really did happen to me and I wanted you to know about it. Thank you Militec!

PS I had to have service on my home air conditioner and asked the service man to put Militec-1 in it. He said he didn't recommend putting anything in there, and I told him I wasn't asking for his recommendation but rather that he should just put it in. He said he didn't want to be responsible if it blew up and didn't want me to blame him. I said I would accept full responsibility. He then agreed to do it. I asked him to check the amperage before and after. He recorded a 9.27% drop in amperage which equates to about \$20 a month savings on my summer electric bill, all for 2 ounces of Militec-1.
